Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Talk with others to solve conflicts.
- Develop appropriate ways of being assertive
- Begin to understand how others might be feeling.
- Talk about their feelings using words like 'happy', 'sad', 'worried.'

Physical Development

- Be increasingly independent as they get dressed and when doing up zips.
- Continue to be increasingly independent as they get dressed and undressed.
- Use a comfortable grip with good control when holding pencils etc.
- Make healthy choices about food, drink, activity etc.
- Practise sports/teams races.

Communication, Language and Literacy

- Know many rhymes, be able to talk about familiar books and be able to tell a long story.
- Use longer sentences of four to six words.
- Write some or all of their name.
- Use some of their print and letter knowledge in early writing.
- Continue to understand the five key concepts about print: - print has meaning - print can have different purposes - we read English text from left to right and from top to bottom - the names of the different parts of a book-page sequencing.

<u>Focus Texts</u> Sharing a Shell, The Boy on the Beach, Sally and the Limpet, The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch, Commotion in the Ocean, Harry and the Dinosaurs go on Holiday.



Mathematics

- Describe a familiar route and locations using words like 'in front of' and 'behind.'
- Continue to compare quantities. .
- Continuing fast recognition of up to 5 objects, without having to count them individually ('subitising').
- Continue to link numerals and amounts.

Expressive Arts and Design

- Play instruments with increasing control and to express their feelings and ideas.
- Continue to show increasing detail in their drawings and paintings.
- Continue to explore different materials freely, in order to develop their ideas about how to use them and what to make.
- Sing the melodic shape (moving melody, such as up and down, down and up) of familiar songs.

<u>RE</u>

- To continue to develop positive attitudes about the differences between people.
- To continue to read and discuss stories from religious texts.
- To continue to celebrate and value cultural, religious and community events and experiences

Understanding of the World

- Know that there are different countries in the world and talk about the differences they have experienced or seen.
- Plant seeds and care for growing plants..
- Understand the key features of the life cycle of a plant and an animal.
- Talk about the differences between materials.
