

English – writing

- Using different styles of writing including narrative Grammar
- Using different sentence types including statements and questions.
- Learning how to use different types of vocabulary including adjectives, conjunctions, sentence openers and noun phrases.

Reading

- Use phonics to read and spell.
- Read as class, in groups and individually.
- Discuss texts and answer questions about them.

Maths– Number

- Using tens and units grids to add and subtract.
- Identifying, counting and making different money amounts.
- Beginning to use a bar model to divide an amount.
- Using 2s, 5s and 10 times tables to solve problems.
- To understand and use language related to time.

DT

- Make a model of a house, shop or other building from their community, using a range of small boxes.
- Create an old fashioned bakery, using different tools to bake bread.

Art

- Design and make posters and advertisements to advertise a 'Big Clean'.
- Look at the work of artists who drew or painted the urban landscapes of their locality.

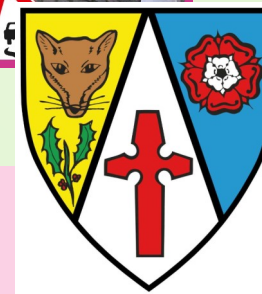
RE

Computing—ICT
