## Reading

- Read and discuss a range of texts as part of our Whole Class Reading work, including our class novels 'Letters from the Lighthouse' and 'Can You See Me?'
- Read and discuss extracts from a range of genres and texts, including those linked to our topics.

## Writing

- Write stories of mystery and suspense.
- Explore and use the features of non-fiction texts such as balanced arguments and explanations.
- Understand how to write formally.
- Write expressionist poetry.
- Consolidate our understanding of Y5/6 grammar and punctuation, such as the use of semi-colons, colons and dashes.
- Learn and use Y5/6 spelling rules as part of writing.

## PE— Dance—Linked to Lion King Production

- Work collaboratively to perform more complex dances
- Compare performances and demonstrate improvement to achieve personal best
- Develop flexibility, balance, strength and control in a range of dances
- Develop group devices and greater use of teamwork
- Demonstrate narrative through contact and relationships
- Show tension through pattern and formation
- Talk about different styles of dance with understanding, using appropriate language and terminology
