Sutton United Football club are looking for budding youngsters for next seasons U7's (2023/24). Interested children will need to be in year <u>1 NOW and year 2 from September 2023</u> to be eligible.

Training will take place on a Saturday morning starting on March 4th 2023 – 08:45 till 09:45 am for 8 to 12 weeks, the price will be £25 per month. During this period representatives from Sutton United will select a group of players to take forward and these players will receive further coaching in preparation for their first season which will start in September 2023.

All children will receive qualified FA coaching and all coaches have been DBS cleared. The training will take place within the established SUFC Soccer School for Children, all children will be able to continue their training for as long as they wish once we have taken the groups onto forming a team.

Our aim is to give children within the community the chance to play football and to learn and develop their fundamental skills, which will give the children the building blocks to be able to play and enjoy football.

Sutton United have teams from under 7s through to open age, so the selected children will hopefully be part of Sutton United FC for many years to come.
