Thank you for your understanding and co-operation.


Admissions

Phase News



Callum 5MC - "We have started auditions for our Christmas production. We are very excited and our teachers said our auditions were fantastic!"


Edward 6W - "I have like doing 3-d Art and strengthening my work with cardboard."

We would like to welcome Karen Woodhall who has joined us as Office Manager at Deanery.




The Ship Opening!

Wednesday Roasts and Friday Feasts - Spring Term


If your child has packed lunches but would like to have either Wednesday Roasts, Friday Feasts or both in Spring 1 then please fill in the form below.


RNIB Stamps Appeal


As a school, we would like to support RNIB this festive season and collect stamps to make a difference to blind and partially sighted people.

We do not usually inform your parents, teachers or anyone else if you contact the school nurse. We might inform someone if we were concerned about your safety, but we would usually speak to you first. Your messages are stored and can be seen by other healthcare staff who follow the same confidentiality rules. We aim to reply to you within one working day and you should get an immediate bounce-back to confirm we received your text. Texts will not be seen outside of normal working hours. If you need help before you hear back from us, contact a member of school staff or your doctor. Our text number does not receive voice calls or MMS picture messages. We support messaging from UK mobile numbers only (which does not include messages sent from landlines, international mobile numbers and some 'number masking' mobile apps). Prevent the school nurse from sending messages to you by texting **STOP** to our number. Please respect your schools mobile phone policy. Messages are charged at zour sub you gate.
